1. Overview

Fruugo is a UK based e-commerce company, which is a global marketplace offering thousands of sellers to cater services of sports and leisure, health and beauty, clothing, home and garden, kids, toys and more. It operates in 23 countries across the globe with great products and enthusiasm to deliver it to the customers.



Fruugo Integration for Magento is a fabulous API integration that helps Magento® store owners to synchronize inventory, price, and other product details for product creation and management between Magento store and Fruugo marketplace.

The Fruugo Integration for Magento extension interacts with Fruugo marketplace to integrate the synchronized product listing between Magento and Fruugo retailers. After the installation, the merchant can create Fruugo categories and the dependent attributes on the Magento store.

The process enables the merchant to configure the desired product category into Magento for automatic submission of selected product on the same category on Fruugo.


Key features are as follows:

- **Upload product based on profile:** An admin can create a profile, map the Fruugo category and attributes to the Magento category and attributes. Then, after assigning the product to the profile can easily upload the product to Fruugo.
- Attribute mapping: The feature allows mapping the suitable existing attribute with Fruugo attributes to one single category of Fruugo.
- **Upload Products in Bulk:** The admin has the option to upload the products in any number of the bulk amount on Fruugo website using this feature.
- Automated Synchronization: The products listing, order, inventory return and refund, and pricing are automatically synchronized at regular interval of time.
- Batch product request download: You can create the batch product download request and fetch the status. Once it turns to finish status, the admin can process by one click.
- Enable and disable of products: A merchant can anytime open and close the products on Fruugo using enable and disable the feature.
- New Order Notifications: Whenever a new order is fetched from Fruugo.com, the admin receives a notification.
- Rejected products notification: If any product containing some invalid details is rejected, then its
 information is fetched from the auto synchronization request along with the error due to which it is
 rejected.
- Simple and configurable product upload: The admin can upload the simple and configurable type of Magento product on the Fruugo website.
- Low Stock Notifications: Whenever Stock diminishes lower than a threshold, a notification is sent informing the status.


2. Fruugo Integration for Magento Installation

To install the extension

- 1. Go to the Magento Admin panel.
- 2. On the top navigation bar, point to the **System** menu. The menu appears as shown in the following figure:



3. Point to the **Magento Connect** menu, and then click **Magento Connect Manager**. The page appears as shown in the following figure:



- 4. Scroll down to the Fruugo_Integration Package.
- 5. In the **Actions** column, select the **Install** option from the list.
- 6. Click the **Commit Changes** button.

 Auto-scroll console contents screen appears and the extension is installed after the process.

3. Fruugo Configuration Settings

Once the extension is successfully installed in the Magento store, the **Fruugo** menu appears on the top navigation bar of the Admin Panel. The merchant has to first create a seller account in the Fruugo seller panel. Once the seller account is created and is approved by Fruugo, then the Magento store owner can use the **Fruugo Username** and **Password** while setting up the Fruugo Configuration settings in the Magento Admin panel.


To set up the configuration settings in the Magento Admin panel

- 1. Go to the Magento Admin panel.
- 2. On the top navigation bar, point to the **Fruugo** menu. The menu appears as shown in the following figure:



Click Configuration.

The **Fruugo Configuration** page appears as shown in the following figure:



- 4. In the right panel, under the **Fruugo Setting** section, do the following steps:
 - a. In the **Enabled** list, select **Yes** to enable the Fruugo Integration extension.
 - b. In the Api Url box, enter the https://www.fruugo.com/ URL.
 - c. In the **Fruugo User Name** box, enter the Fruugo seller account Username.
 - d. In the Fruugo User Password box, enter the Fruugo seller account Password.
 - e. In the **Debug mode** list, select **Yes** to start Fruugo Integration in the debug mode. It captures the log for the debug process.
 - f. In the **Select Store** list, select the single store.
 - g. In the Choose Default Payment Method for Fruugo Orders list, select Fruugo Orders.
 - h. In the Order Prefix for Fruugo Orders box, enter the required prefix value.


For instance, enter *FG*- for *FG-10001*.

- i. In the Store Admin Email Id box, enter the required email Id.
- j. In the **Enable Automated Shipment** list, select the required option.
- 5. Click the **Save Config** button to save the entered values.
- 6. Scroll down to the **Fruugo Cron Management** tab, and then click the tab.

The tab is expanded and the corresponding field under the section appears as shown in the following figure:



- 7. Under Fruugo Cron Management, do the following step:
 - In the **Cron Chunk Size** list, select the required chunk size for the cron jobs to synchronize product on fruugo.com.
- 8. Scroll down to the **Product Edit Settings** tab, and then click the tab.
 The tab is expanded and the corresponding fields under the section appear as shown in the following figure:




- 9. Under **Product Edit Settings**, enable or disable the following fields based on the business requirement:
 - Auto Sync With Fruugo: If selected Yes, then it auto disables the product on fruugo.com if the product is disabled or deleted.
 - Show Upload Button: If selected Yes, then it displays the product upload button on the product edit page.
 - Send Configurable (Parent) Product's Name: Select Yes to send parent product name during configurable products upload if required.
 - Send Configurable (Parent) Product's Price: Select Yes to send parent product price (similar to the price displayed on the Magento front-end view) during configurable products upload if required.
 - Send Configurable (Parent) Product's Image: Select Yes to send parent product image (similar
 to the image displayed on the Magento front-end view) during configurable products upload if
 required.
 - Send Configurable (Parent) Product's Description: Select Yes to send parent product description (similar to the product description displayed on the Magento front-end view) during configurable products upload if required.
 - Send Configurable (Parent) Product's Description: Select Yes to send a short description of the parent product(similar to the product description displayed on the Magento front-end view) during configurable products upload if required.
 - · Disable Child Products: If required, select Yes to archive the child product on fruugo.com once

its parent config product is disabled or deleted.

10. Scroll down to the **Fruugo Required Fields Mapping With Magento Attributes** tab, and then click the tab.

The tab is expanded and the corresponding fields under the section appear as shown in the following figure:



In this section, the admin has to select the Magento attributes code to map them with the respective Fruugo attributes.

- 11. Under the **Fruugo Required Fields Mapping With Magento Attributes** section, enter the product attribute codes in the following fields used for sending information on Fruugo:
 - Product Id: Select attribute code for the product Id. Attribute type used is Text 5 to 500 characters.
 - **Identifier Mapping:** Select the respective **Magento Attribute** if exist to map it with the displayed **Identifier**.
 - Brand: Select attribute code for Brand of the product. Attribute type used is Text 1 to 100 characters
 - **Product Title**: Select attribute code for the title of the product. Attribute type used is Text 5 to 500 characters.

- **Product Description**: Select attribute code for the description of the product. Attribute type used is Text 1 to 2000 characters.
- Fruugo Product Price: This is to set a different price for all the products.
 The user can set the price on the following basis:
 - Increase by Fixed Price: If selected, then the Enter Amount field appears.
 - Increase by Fixed Percentage: If selected, then the Enter Percentage field appears. Enter the numeric value to increase the price of the Fruugo product price by the entered value % of Magento price

For Example, Magento price + 5% of Magento price.

Magento Price = 100

Select Increase By Fixed Percentage option

Enter Percentage = 5

100 + 5% of 100 = 100 + 5 = 105

Thus, Fruugo Product Price = 105

- Decrease by Fixed Price: If selected, then the Enter Amount field appears.
- Decrease by Fixed Percentage: If selected, then the Enter Percentage field appears.
 Enter the numeric value to decrease the price of the Fruugo product price by the entered value % of Magento price

For Example, Magento price - 5% of Magento price.

Magento Price = 100

Select Decrease By Fixed Percentage option

Enter Percentage = 5

100 - 5% of 100 = 100 - 5 = 95

Thus, Fruugo Product Price = 95

- Product Price: Select the required option to send product price with vat or without vat.
- Price Vat Rate: Enter the required value.

Note: Enter **0** for non-EU based retailers where VAT is not applicable.

12. Scroll down to the **Fruugo Recommended Fields Mapping With Magento Attributes** tab, and then click the tab.


The tab is expanded and the corresponding fields under the section appear as shown in the following figure:



In this section, the admin has to select the Magento attributes code to map them with the respective Fruugo attributes.

- 13. Under the **Fruugo Recommended Fields Mapping With Magento Attributes** section, enter the product attribute codes used for sending information on Fruugo in the following fields:
 - Language: Select the two-letter ISO code of the language in the lower case. Attribute type used is Text.
 - Attribute Size: Select the attribute code for the size of the product. Attribute type used is Text.
 - Attribute Color: Select the attribute code for the color of the product. Attribute type used is Text.
 - Currency: Select the three-letter ISO code of the currency in the upper case. Attribute type used is Text.
 - Discount Price: Select the Fruugo Attribute for the Discount Price With VAT or Discount Price Without VAT to map it with the respective Magento attribute.
 - **Note**: Selecting the Fruugo attribute from the **Discount Price** list displays the selected **Fruggo attribute** just below the other Fruugo attributes and the respective Magento attribute is autoselected in the corresponding list.
- 14. Scroll down to the **Fruugo Optional Fields Mapping With Magento Attributes** tab, and then click the tab.

The tab is expanded and the corresponding fields under the section appear as shown in the following figure:



In this section, the admin has to select the Magento attributes code to map them with the respective Fruugo attributes.

- 15. Under the **Fruugo optional Fields Mapping With Magento Attributes** section, enter the product attribute codes used for sending information on Fruugo in the following fields:
 - ISBN-13: Select the attribute code for the type of standard product code of 13 digits.
 - ISBN-10: Select the attribute code for the type of standard product code of 10 digits.
 - **Restock Date**: Select the attribute code for the restock date, that is, the date when the product stock will be available again for the orders. Attribute type used is Select or Text.
 - **Manufacturer**: Select the attribute code for the information related to the Manufacturer. Attribute type used is Select or Text 100 characters.
 - **Lead Time**: It indicates the approximate number of days delayed by the day when the order to the item has been dispatched from the warehouse.
 - **Note**: Use the lead time only when the time exceeds 24 hours as 1 day is the default product value.
 - Package Weight: Shipping weight information. The Value must be greater than equal to 0.01.

- Discount Price Start Date: The date from when the discount price is applicable.
- Discount Price End Date: The date from till when the discount price is applicable.
- 16. Click the Save Config button.

The Configuration Settings are saved.

4. Manage Fruugo Profiles

Admin can create a new profile and assign the required products to the profile. While creating and editing the profile, admin can map the Magento attributes to the Fruugo attributes. These attributes are applicable to all the products that are assigned to the profile.

Admin can do the following tasks:

4.1. Add A New Profile

To add a new profile

- 1. Go to the **Magento Admin** panel.
- 2. On the top navigation bar, point to the **Fruugo** menu. The menu appears as shown in the following figure:



3. Click the Manage Profile menu.

- 5. In the right panel, under **Profile Information**, do the following steps:
 - a. In the **Profile Code** box, enter a profile code.

Note: It is only for the internal use. Use the unique profile code with no spaces. Start with small letters.


- b. In the **Profile Name** box, enter the name of the profile.
 - Note: Use the unique name to identify the profile.
- c. In the Status list, select Active to enable the profile.
 - **Note:** The Inactive option disables the profile.
- 6. Click the Save and Continue button.
- 7. In the left navigation panel, click the **Fruugo Category Mapping** menu.

The page appears as shown in the following figure:



- 8. In the right panel, under Fruugo Category Mapping, do the following step:
 - In the Select Preferred Fruugo Category to be Mapped list, select the required category.
- 9. In the left navigation panel, click the **Profile Products** menu.











5. Manage the Products Assigned to the Profile

On this page, admin can view and edit the product, validate and upload the individual product. Also, the admin can view the error message if any error exists in any product details. The admin can also submit certain actions on the selected products available on the **Product Manager** page.

Thus, on the Product Manager page, the user can perform the following tasks:

- Submit Actions on the Selected Products of the same Profile(https://docs.cedcommerce.com/mage nto/fruugo-magento-integration-0-0-1?section=search-submit-actions-on-the-selected-products-ofthe-same-profile)
 - : The user can validate and upload the products of the same profile those are listed on the **Product Manager** page to the Fruugo Web site. The user can also submit the other respective actions on the selected products before uploading them to fruugo.com.
- View the Error Log and Validation

 - : If the product is invalid, then an **Invalid** button appears, and the admin can view the error log using the **Invalid** button. Also, the admin can view the error log through using the **Log** link.
- Edit Product Information(https://docs.cedcommerce.com/magento/fruugo-magento-integration-0-0-1?section=edit-the-product-information-2)
 - : Edit the information of the product that the user wants to upload on the Fruugo Web site.

5.1. Submit Actions on the Selected Products of the same Profile

Admin can submit the following actions for the selected products:

- Validate Products: To validate the product before uploading it to the fruugo.com. It displays the corresponding validation error if any. If there is no error, it confirms that the product is ready to upload.
- Validate & Upload Products to Frugo: To validate the product before uploading it on the fruugo.com. It displays the corresponding validation error for all the products if any. If there is no error, then it validates the selected products and then uploads them to the fruugo.com.

To validate products of the same profile

- 1. Go to the **Magento Admin** panel.
- 2. On the top navigation bar, point to the **Fruugo** menu. The menu appears as shown in the following figure:



3. Click the Manage Profile menu.


















6.1. Fruugo Orders Details

To ship the order


- 1. Go to the **Magento Admin** panel.


4. Click the **Fetch Latest Fruugo Orders** button.

5. In the **Magento Order#** column, click the link associated with the required order. The page appears as shown in the following figure:



6. In the left navigation menu, click **Ship By Fruugo**. The page appears as shown in the following figure:



- 7. Under **Shipment Info**, do the following steps:
 - a. In the Tracking Url box, enter the valid Tracking URL if any.
 - b. In the Tracking Code box, enter the required value.
 - c. In the Message To Customer box, enter the required message.
 - d. In the Message To Fruugo box, enter the required message.
- 8. Under **Shipment Items**, do the following steps:
 - a. Quantity Confirmed
 - b. In the Quantity to Ship box, enter a value.
 The number of the quantity that the user can ship. The value cannot be greater than the Qty Available for Ship value.
 - c. In the Quantity Cancel box, enter a value.
 The number of the quantity that the user wants to reject. The value cannot be greater than the Qty Available for Ship value.
- 9. Click the Submit Shipment button.

The success message appears if the order is shipped successfully.

To Delete Orders

- 1. Go to the **Magento Admin** panel.
- 2. On the top navigation bar, click the **Fruugo** menu.
- 3. On the **Fruugo** menu, point to **Manage Orders**, and then click **View FruugoOrders**. The **Fruugo Order Details** page appears as shown in the following figure:



- 4. Select the check boxes associated with the Orders that the admin wants to delete.

- 6. Click the Submit button.


A confirmation dialog box appears.


To export the Fruugo Order Details through CSV file

The users can view the list of failed Fruugo orders on the Failed Fruugo Orders Import Log page.


Orders cannot be imported from Fruugo due to the following conditions:

- If the selected Payment Method in Fruugo System Configuration Setting is not available in Magento.

To manage failed Fruugo Orders


- 1. Go to the Magento Admin panel.
